## **Church is not about the building, but about the people**

Following the Government's recent announcements, and in line with guidance from The Methodist Church, Ashbourne Methodist Church has agreed to cancel all face-to-face services, events and meetings until further notice.

Nevertheless, even during these unprecedented circumstances, we will continue to be a church family and to serve our community.

### **Serving Our Community**

Our church serves the local community in many ways, including through Craft & Chat, kids@cornerstone, The Cornerstone Coffee Shop, Lunch Club and Messy Church. Many in our community will be feeling worried or lonely, or may be concerned about how they will get supplies if they need to self-isolate.

I encourage everyone to think about how we can support our neighbours and community during this time.

Many members of our church are already involved in the Ashbourne area community support scheme, so please think about whether you can be involved as well. Councillor Ann Smith is coordinating this response.

Ashbourne Food Bank is likely to need additional donations, so please consider whether you can support them. You can contact them on 01335 661237.

If you need help, there are many people in our town who are ready to support you. It is important that you ask for help if you need it.

### **Praying for our World**

As we will be spending more time at home, we can spend time praying for our world, our community and ourselves.

Our website calendar has been adapted to include prompts to pray for specific things throughout the week. We are particularly concerned to pray for those who will be feeling isolated as they cannot attend their usual activities.

This Sunday, 22<sup>nd</sup> March, I invite you to respond to the national call to prayer issued by Church Together in England. At 7pm this Sunday, light a candle\* in the windows of your homes as a visible symbol of the light of life, Jesus Christ, our source and hope in prayer.

## **Worship**

Although we cannot gather in the same place to worship, we will continue to worship God as his people in this town.
