ACE continues to support a large number of vulnerable young people, and is as busy as ever. ACE provides many types of support for young people, in particular groups, and also on a one to one basis.

The regular groups include two youth clubs (Wednesday Club and Thursday Club) to which particular young people may be referred. These clubs provide a safe space where young people can have fun, and also learn and develop in a number of different ways.

There is a club for young people who potentially may struggle with the transition to senior school. There are also separate boys and girls clubs (the A Team and Space for You) for those who are struggling in school in a number of different ways. The young people are taken out of school in small groups for a range of activities to help them address their particular needs and gain resilience.

A summer program has been set up to run through the school summer holidays. This involves a number of trips and activities, and culminates in a visit to the House of Commons.

A number of new volunteers have come forward recently, and please pray for them as they develop their skills and also relationships with the ACE young people. ACE greatly values the prayer support it receives, along with financial, volunteering and in kind assistance.
